# **CLIMATE CHANGE**

## **TEMPERATURES AND WEATHER PATTERNS**

## Why Global Warming is a Big Problem

Global warming is when the Earth gets hotter due to certain gases (like carbon dioxide and greenhouse gases) which gets trapped in the atmosphere. These gases act like blankets, keeping the heat in. This might sound cosy, but it can actually be very bad for our planet, Earth.

## What Causes Global Warming?

Most of the gases that make the Earth warmer come from things we do, like driving cars, using electricity, and cutting down trees. Factories and farms also release gases like methane, which is extremely powerful at trapping heat.

When we burn fuels like coal, oil, and gas to power things, we release carbon dioxide into the air. Trees usually help by absorbing carbon dioxide, but cutting down too many forests means there are fewer trees to help.

## What is the impact of global warming?

1. Melting Ice: Ice in the North and South Pole is melting really fast. This makes oceans rise, which then causes floods sometimes where people live.

2. Crazy weather: Global warming makes storms, heatwaves, droughts and more dangerous things. Sometimes it rains too much and sometimes it doesn't even rain at all!

3. Animals in Danger: Some animals, such as polar bears, are losing their habitats as the ice in their homes is melting. Other species of animals might also not be able to survive during hotter weather.

4. Hotter Days: As we notice this year, summers in the UK are getting warmer than usual (The average temperature in the summer is 28°C).



### Saving the Environment.

Save the earth! 'Life means protecting our planet' we protect all living things in nature, including us. Keeping Earth clean means saving all living things. Our environment provides us with water, food, clean air and other vital resources essential for our survival. It is very important to maintain biodiversity so we can stay safe and also keep the poor in good health. Human activities like deforestation and pollution have created menace by threatening this.


## **Children In Need**



The trip showed us: a Victorian classroom, a Victorian street, Victorian houses, real Victorian shops that you could interact with and even Victorian vehicles. Did you know that....

 The first postal system called 'The Penny Post' was introduced in 1840. Letters could be paid for using the first ever postage stamp called 'Penny Black'. Christmas cards were printed in Britain in 1843 and were sent to others using this postal system. Queen Victoria was the first person shown on a stamp.

2. Queen Victoria was born on the 24th May 1819 in Kensington Palace. She was the daughter of the Duke of Kent.

3. In 1870 it became compulsory for all primary aged children to attend school. However it was not free and poor families were unable to afford it. Parents had to wait until 1891 which was when school became free to all. Some families were not happy about this, as it meant young workers who had been earning would now not be making money for their family.

## **Cost Of Living Crisis**

Prices are hiking up in the UK! Due to inflation in the UK, the Covid-19 pandemic, the Ukraine war and less supply of food the cost of things is higher than ever. The UK cost of living crisis has changed from October 2020 to November 2024 where prices have increased up to 24%! On Tuesday, November the 26th 2024, Israel fired its biggest simultaneous attack on Beirut. Many of them were launched in Hezbollah in the southern suburbs of the Lebanese capital. The Israel military have issued evacuations for over 20 locations in Beirut, urging citizens to keep a distance of at least 500 meters. These strikes have been described as the most destructive attack of this conflict so far, as there were just 10 explosions in a small amount of time.

The international community, which also includes the European Union and the United Nations, have urged Israel to find a resolution to this conflict and stop it, once and for all. Unfortunately, some of Israel's officials have been arguing and have said that the agreement could be a missed opportunity to completely remove Hezbollah.

These big impacts have been very severe, with many buildings being damaged and people being injured. Hospitals in Beirut have been crowded with many injured civilians and are massively in need of medical supplies. Like what was said before, the international community have been trying to help and this time they have been calling for assistance to aid Beirut's citizens to ensure their safety and to support the affected population. 9

# **Hurricane Milton**

In October 2024, a category 5 hurricane struck the USA. It was named Milton and destroyed hundreds of homes in Florida. This destructive hurricane was so large that it was able to be spotted from space on satellite imagery. Some of the damage included flooding, power loss to 3 million homes and businesses and sadly the loss of 14 lives.



## **American Election**

The 2024 American election was held on Tuesday November 5th 2024. In the presidential election, voters choose their president and vice president. A vice president is the second highest official in the US government. Every four years, citizens cast their votes for electors, who then elect the president based on the popular vote in each state. The election is democratic, which means that everyone in the state's views are heard.

In the USA there are two political parties - the Democrats and the Republicans. People who want to have the chance to become a president put themselves forward and each party choose their nominee through a process of voting.

## What's an Election?

An election is when people vote to choose leaders or make decisions. The person with the most votes wins. A candidate is a person who is being looked at or considered for a job, position, award or other opportunities.

## How does the US election work?

In the US election, people first vote in primaries to choose candidates. Then, parties pick their official candidate. On Election Day, voters choose a candidate, but they are really voting for electors who will pick the president.
