Early Years Weekly Overview

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Phonics	Time to Talk
We will be listening to different environmental sounds (fireworks, aeroplanes, birds, leaves etc.) and using words to describe what we can hear.	You may ask your child what they have done at Nursery and they might not be able to tell you. By asking them a more specific or open ended question, it will support them to respond. Each week we will offer a suggestion of a topic to talk about with your child.
For example, "I can hear the leaves crunching when I step on them", "The firework whizzed and banged ."	 Ask your child Tell me about a song you sang at Nursery? What did you enjoy about today? Did you see a pumpkin at Nursery?
