This week we will also focus on them doing their own zips up. Balance – Encourage your child to balance on one leg. You could make it into a challenge – How long can you balance for?

Encourage your child to talk in longer sentences. A great way to do this is by modelling sentences to them. For example, if your child requests "water" you can model saying, "Can I have a drink of water please".
