**This half term our topic is: Bears**

<p>This week our focus is on being proud of ourselves.</p> <p>We will share photos and art work with the children and talk to them about how proud we are of their efforts. This could be anything from sharing a toy to painting their firework picture.</p> <p>We will also be reinforcing our behaviour ladder. The children all have their photo on the green level. If the children try their best, make a series of good choices or exceed our expectations they will be moved up to the gold level. Each week children who have been moved to gold could be selected to receive our Nursery certificate. If a child makes a choice that does not meet our behavioural expectations or has three warnings about their behaviour choices they will be moved down to red. This week we have a new video available to help you support your child's communication skills.</p> <p><b>This week's key vocabulary</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Bear, claws, fur, ears, eyes</li> <li>• Over, under, through</li> <li>• Listen, sit, look, listen</li> </ul>	<p>The children take part in activities every day that will help them to strengthen the muscles in their hands.</p> <p>Strong hands mean that your child will be able to hold and control one-handed tools, for example, pens, pencils and scissors.</p> <p>Strong hands will also make your child more independent; they will be able to tackle everyday activities with more control. 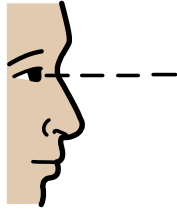

<p><b>Phonics</b></p>		<p><b>Do you have any stories at home that are about bears or have bear characters in them? Happy reading!</b></p>
<p>Can your child hear a sound and then repeat it? For example, howl like a wolf, growl like a bear, tweet like a bird.
