Introduction	Today children will start learning about time. They will discuss lots of the vocabulary associated with time and link it to their own experiences. They will think about things that happen before and after an event.	Today children will recap the days of the week and months of the year. They will answer questions by putting them in order such as 'If today is Friday, tomorrow is?'	Today children will start using clocks to tell the time. They will look at the numbers on the clock and the two different hands. They will practise reading the clock when the minute hand is on the 12 and saying o'clock.	Today children will continue using clocks to find times on the hour and half past the hour. They will learn that the minute hand points to the 6 when it is half past and the hour hand is in the middle of the hour.
Activities	Children will practise using the new vocabulary in simple sentences such as 'Before I get dressed, I brush my teeth.' They will also practise ordering pictures before and after and writing a simple story using 'First, then, now'.	The children will order the days of the week and fill in the missing months of the year. They will answer questions about which day comes after or before. Their challenge is to read sentences and decide if they are true or false.	Children will practise making different times on their individual clocks. They will make sure they use the correct hands for the minute and the hour. They will go on to find the time one hour after and match times of the day on their clocks.	Children will practise making half past on their individual clocks. They will make sure the hour hand is in the middle of the hour. They will match clocks to different times and try to find the time one hour after.

Phonics APS Phonics- Phase 5 — Taught daily This week, the children will be continuing phase 5 alternative spellings. First, they will be shown the original graphemes and phonemes before moving onto the alternative spelling. The alternative spellings for this week are: igh, oa, sh. Next, children will practise segmenting and blending to be able to read words and sentences containing these alternative spellings. Finally, they will use their phonic knowledge to write word associated sentences. Friday's lesson will focus on tricky words and high frequency words.
